PATIENTS & FAMILY CAREGIVERS: PRESCRIPTION DRUG AFFORDABILITY CHALLENGES DURING COVID-19

KEY FINDINGS FROM A NATIONAL SURVEY OF PATIENTS & CAREGIVERS



A MAJORITY OF PATIENTS RELY ON COPAY ASSISTANCE TO AFFORD THEIR MEDICATIONS

65% of respondents either currently use or have used copay assistance programs to afford their medications.

60% of respondents said they would have extreme difficulty affording their medications without copay assistance being applied to their out-of-pocket costs.



PATIENTS HAVE FACED INCREASED AFFORDABILITY CHALLENGES DURING COVID-19 **46%** of respondents said they are someone in their immediate household has not been able to afford their out-of-pocket costs in the past year.

44% of respondents reported having negatively been impacted by COVID-19, including health care affordability challenges.



PEOPLE OF COLOR DISPROPORTIONATELY EXPERIENCE AFFORDABILITY ISSUES

33% of respondents who were unable to afford their medications or treatments because assistance ran out were persons of color.

38% of respondents with a bleeding disorder who were unable to afford their medications or treatments because assistance ran out were persons of color.

93% of respondents said the federal government should require health insurers and pharmacies to count the value of copay assistance toward patient out-of-pocket cost responsibilities.

83% of respondents reported out-of-pocket costs as being their most important health care problem.

WHAT PATIENTS ARE SAYING ABOUT COPAY ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

"Copay assistance programs are the only reason I was able to afford medications before my current job, salary increase. A couple years ago, I was making around fifty thousand dollars a year and had student loans totaling twenty thousand dollars. Between my insurance copay and my student loan debt repayments, I was hardly able to stay above water. Copay assistance programs saved me from taking out even more debt to pay for my life saving medications."
