# **NBDF Application Process Overview**

The National Bleeding Disorders Foundation (NBDF) uses a two-stage application process:

- 1. Letter of Intent (LOI)
- 2. Full Application (by invitation only)

# 1. Letter of Intent (LOI)

The LOI helps NBDF determine if a proposed project aligns with our mission and whether the applicant meets eligibility criteria before submitting a full proposal.

#### **Submission Platform:**

Eligible applicants will be invited to submit a full application through ProposalCentral.

#### **Required LOI Components:**

• LOI Letter (2 pages maximum)

Address to: *Members of NBDF's Research Review Committee* Include:

- o Introduction of the applicant
- Confirmation of eligibility
- Information about the proposed mentor
- A brief summary of the research project
- Biosketches for both applicant and mentor, which must follow NIH format (5 pages max).
   Template: NIH Biosketch Format (Rev. 10/2021)
- Additional Required Information:
  - o Applicant's name, degrees, current position
  - Institutional affiliation
  - Applicant ORCiD ID
  - o Basic demographic information

# 2. Full Application (by invitation only)

Invited applicants will have access to the full application form via ProposalCentral.

#### **Required Application Sections:**

• Applicant Background and Commitment to Career

(2,000 characters max)

Describe your background, experience in bleeding disorders, and career goals in research, clinical care, and/or academia.

Abstract

(2,000 characters max)

Provide a summary of your research, including hypothesis, aims, and methods.

Expanded Background and Future Plans

(2,500 characters max)

Further elaborate on your long-term commitment to the bleeding disorders field, particularly how this project aligns with your professional goals.

#### • List of Prior NBDF Awards (if any)

## • Budget Justification

(up to 75,000 characters)

The budget should align with NBDF guidelines and may include:

- o Reasonable salary support for the grantee
- o Research supplies
- o Travel to conferences or for training
- Publication costs
