MASAC RESOLUTION ON STEM CELL RESEARCH FOR POTENTIAL CURE OF BLEEDING DISORDERS

The following recommendations were approved by the Medical and Scientific Advisory Council (MASAC) of the National Hemophilia Foundation on April 8, 2005, and adopted by the NHF Board of Directors on June 4, 2005.

Embryonic and adult stem cell research offers the potential to cure hemophilia and other bleeding disorders and their complications.

The Medical and Scientific Advisory Council (MASAC) of the National Hemophilia Foundation unanimously supports embryonic and adult stem cell research as a legitimate and important area of scientific investigation and as a vital avenue of research toward curing hemophilia and other bleeding disorders.
